

Explain how the absence of suffering and conflict in Brave New World shapes citizens and why this creates a dystopian society.

The dystopian society (in) presented in Brave New World functions like a metaphoric cage, keeping its (citizens) isolated from the real (world) sorrows of the world. In this model, people are conditioned in such a way that makes suffering almost impossible, both coming from external sources (etc) as well as from the individuals themselves. This leads to, among other things, the incapacity to deal or even think about the slightest conflict, while substituting critical thinking with ignorance and the abuse of recreational substances. Therefore, the main dystopian (characteristic) of this "ideal (perfect) society" is the illusion of happiness, defined by the citizens' lack of true "contrast", the "ups and downs" of life, only acting like they were told to act, and only feeling happy and fulfilled because they were told that so they were, (and always with ~~the~~ ~~best~~) thus sacrificing true freedom for what they were conditioned to think is best.
